Julian Knight - Eligibility for a Reparation Payment

Background

On 5 May 2016, the Minister for Defence, Senator the Hon Marise Payne, and the Minister for Justice, the Hon Michael Keenan MP, directed the Defence Abuse Response Taskforce that where an applicant for a reparation payment under the Defence Abuse Reparation Scheme has been convicted of a serious crime, no reparation payment should be made to them.

The Ministers further directed that, in determining whether a crime is a serious crime, it should adopt the starting proposition that a serious crime is one attracting a maximum sentence of over 10 years.

Issue

Mr Julian Knight has submitted a completed Application for Reparation Payment (Attachment A). Mr Knight has made allegations of physical abuse and workplace bullying and harassment occurring at RMC Duntroon between January and July 1987 which have been assessed as in scope and plausible (please refer to the CMS Assessment Note at Attachment B).

The information available to the Taskforce is that Mr Knight has been convicted of 7 counts of murder and 46 counts of attempted murder due to his involvement in the 'Hoddle Street Massacre' of August 1987. The maximum sentence for the crimes of murder and attempted murder is greater than 10 years. No facto save been identified that suggest these convictions were not for serious crimes.

Recommendation:

A. That you note the factors listed above and make a preliminary determination that Mr Knight has been convicted of a serious crime and is therefore not eligible for a reparation payment.
